Queen Anne School is a private, Episcopal-affiliated, co-educational day school that rigorously prepares its students for college and for life. Founded by St. Barnabas' Church in 1964, the school is located on a 50-acre campus in a suburban environment midway between Washington, D.C. and Annapolis, Maryland.

THE FACULTY

There are 18 full time faculty members, for a faculty-to-student ratio of approximately 1:7. The faculty has earned a total of 18 Bachelor's degrees, 6 Master's degrees, and 2 Law Degrees. Several faculty members are actively pursuing graduate studies.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Community Service provides students with a program which will grow with them from entry in the sixth grade through graduation. Students participate as follows:

6th & 7th Grades: Students are given the opportunity to participate in canned food drives and other activities during the academic year. (10 hours)

8th Grade: Students participate in community service projects which give them practical experience. (10 hours)

9th through 12th Grades: Students begin individual service projects and are given additional opportunities for leadership. 100 service hours are required to graduate. (30, 30, 30, and 10)

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

A minimum of 25 ½ credits in the ninth through twelfth grades is required for graduation. Credits are distributed as follows:

Students must successfully complete the following courses: Algebra II, Physics, Biology, Chemistry, US History, World History, and Government.

THE STUDENT BODY

Queen Anne School enrolls approximately 120 students in grades 6-12. The average class size is 12 students, depending on the nature and subject of the course. The admission process is aimed at the student of average to above average ability. We welcome all qualified students regardless of race, gender, religion, sexual orientation, ethnic or national origin.

HONOR CODE

Trust, respect, responsibility, and honesty are fundamental principles which must be upheld by all members of the Queen Anne School community in order to create an atmosphere in which scholarship and integrity flourish. Queen Anne School believes in the value of the honor system as conceived by its founders and as applied to the preparation of a student's work and the taking of examinations. The school believes that the honor system is part of a larger standard of behavior that applies to all that a student does as a member of the community.

GRADING SYSTEM

A 4.0 system of grading is followed in every department of the school. In order to complete a course satisfactorily, a student must achieve a minimum average of C- for the grading period. To earn Honor Roll recognition, a student must receive a GPA of 3.0 or higher with no letter grade below a B- and no non-academic grade below an S. To earn High Honors, a student must achieve a GPA of 3.7 or higher with no letter grade below a B and no non-academic grade below S.
